Program Choice (Select One Activity)

Dates: July 10th – August 21st.

Time: 9:00 am to 12 noon (prompt)

Igbo Language/Arts: Open to all ages.

Students will increase their knowledge of the Igbo language through language instructions and visual arts.

Music (Singing and Dancing with Drumming): Ages 6-15

Student will increase their knowledge of the Igbo culture through native songs and dances.

Music (Standard Drumming): Ages 6-15

Students will learn how to drum West African rhythms.

Cooking: Ages 13-18

Students will learn how to prepare and cook different ethnic foods.

Students Volunteer: Ages 16-18
